This role blends clinical creativity with relational skill, designing evidence-based, developmentally appropriate group curricula to support healing. In addition to group leadership, the therapist will carry a small individual caseload, providing direct clinical care to clients as needed. This is an excellent opportunity for a clinician passionate about family systems, group work, and making a meaningful impact in a flexible, part-time capacity.

Position Overview:

Qualifications:

- Master's degree in mental health field (Counseling, Social Work, Marriage and Family Therapy)
- State of Texas licensure to practice – Licensed Professional Counselor Associate (LPC); Marriage and Family Therapist (MFT); Licensed Master Social Worker (LMSW) OR Provisional licensure, such as LPC-Associate, LMFT-Associate, LMSW
- Prefer a minimum of two years combined professional experience working with child abuse victims and families, providing individual, family, group therapy, or other evidence-based treatment modalities, including TF-CBT.
- Working knowledge of the dynamics of sexual abuse and trauma
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills
- Organizational skills
- Must be comfortable in presenting information and developing community relationships
- Must be a good team player
- Ability to pass annual criminal and DFPS background checks, as well as clear the National Sex Offender Public Website and SafeSport registries
- Knowledge and practice in Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (TF-CBT) preferred
- Fluency in English (both in written and verbal communication) is required.
- Bilingual fluency in Spanish not required, but is a definite plus

Job Tasks:

- Provide clinical assessment of child victims and non-offending family members.
- Provide individual, family, and group counseling to child victims and non-offending family members using evidence-based treatment modalities, including TF-CBT.
- Develop, coordinate, and lead therapeutic groups that promote healing, build coping skills, foster resilience, and encourage peer support in a safe and supportive environment.
- Complete individualized treatment plans.
- Measure treatment progress by assessing improvement on clinical assessment tools.
- Document session notes in client charts, provide written reports as appropriate, and enter service data in a database.
- Provide crisis intervention for clients receiving other primary services of the Center.
- Provide therapy to children with problematic sexual behavior and their caregivers.
- Prepare child victims and witnesses for court.
- Provide witness testimony in court, if requested
- Complete 40 hours of training in an evidence-supported mental health treatment related to child abuse and/or trauma within the first year.

- Complete a minimum of eight (8) contact hours of continuing education in the field of child abuse, trauma, clinical practice, and /or cultural applications every two (2) years.
- Participate in ongoing clinical supervision and/or consultation
- Attend monthly staff and multi-disciplinary team meetings as assigned
- Demonstrate flexibility in scheduling by maintaining on-site availability during peak client service hours, including afternoons and evenings (2:00 p.m.–7:00 p.m.), to support after-school group therapy programming and meet the needs of children and families.
- Maintain a comprehensive knowledge of the organization's mission, core values, and the children's advocacy center model
- Perform additional duties as assigned

Physical Requirements:

- Must be mobile and able to bend, stoop, reach, and moderately lift (up to 30 pounds)
- Must be able to sit/stand at a workstation and/or a computer screen for up to 2 hours at a time
